## REAL ESTATE CONCENTRATION

The concentration in real estate provides students with the knowledge base in finance, real estate investment, development, valuation, and strategic planning to help prepare them for an entry-level position in the real estate industry. Most of the field courses in this concentration are at the graduate level, which may give students who complete the program a competitive advantage visavis students from other universities. For GWSB students interested in real estate who already are taking such courses, this concentration provides a vehicle to help quantify their commitment to real estate to potential employers.

**REQUIREMENTS**

The following requirements must be fulfilled for the concentration in real estate: 15 credits in required and selected courses; at least 9 of these credits must be taken in residence. All concentration courses must be completed with a minimum grade of *C*-.
