

DUAL BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN HEALTH SCIENCES WITH A MAJOR IN CLINICAL RESEARCH ADMINISTRATION AND MASTER OF SCIENCE IN HEALTH SCIENCES IN THE FIELD OF BIOMEDICAL INFORMATICS

The School of Medicine and Health Sciences offers a dual bachelor of science in health sciences with a major in clinical research administration (<http://bulletin.gwu.edu/medicine-health-sciences/undergraduate-programs/bshs-clinical-research-administration/>) and master of science in health sciences in the field of biomedical informatics (<http://bulletin.gwu.edu/medicine-health-sciences/graduate-programs/mshs-biomedical-informatics/>) degree program. The program allows students to take 9 graduate credits as part of their undergraduate program, thereby decreasing the number of credits normally required for the master's degree. All requirements for both degrees must be fulfilled.
