The College of Professional Studies offers a dual bachelor of professional studies with a major in information technology (http://bulletin.gwu.edu/professional-studies/bps-information-technology/) and master of professional studies in the field of cybersecurity strategy and information management (http://bulletin.gwu.edu/professional-studies/mps-cybersecurity-strategy-information-management/) degree program. The program allows for double counting 9 credits between programs, thereby decreasing the number of credits normally required for the master's degree. All requirements for both degrees must be fulfilled.

Interested students should confer with their academic advisor in the fall semester of their senior year. Applications to the dual program are due in early December of the senior year.
