# MINOR IN PUBLIC HEALTH

Minor fields of study have been established at George Washington University to provide opportunities for formal inter/intra-school study. Students must be enrolled in a degree program and must be in good standing to be eligible to take a minor field of study in another school. Upon successful completion of all requirements, the minor field of study and the courses taken in support of the minor are entered on the student's transcript. To apply for the minor in public health, students must have a minimum GPA of 2.75.

The following requirements must be fulfilled:18 credits total, including 9 credits in required courses and 9 credits in elective courses. All courses must be taken for a letter grade and a minimum grade of C- must be earned in each.
